



March 9 meeting was discussed. It will be a membership building meeting, with all current members being asked to bring a friend. Congressman Warren Davidson will be the speaker. Social and Membership Committees are working on location, which will be announced later.

Delores Ely motioned, seconded by Katie Grow, to adjourn the meeting. President Hill adjourned the meeting at 7:40 p.m.
