REGULAR MEETING MINUTES -- Monday, June 10,2024

At 6 p.m. dinner orders were taken. President Robyn Whitaker welcomed us to the meeting. After dinner Betty Hill led the Pledge of Allegiance and Robyn Whitaker led us in prayer.

Our evening speaker, Pat Longfellow, director of LifeWise Academy was introduced by President Robyn Whitaker. LifeWise is a bible based character education program. "Intelligence plus character - that is the goal of true education", quote of Martin Luther King, Jr. LifeWise Academy in Greenville opened in 2022. Independent research has documented that students participating in RTRI programs do better academically and have fewer behavioral problems than those students who do not participate. Schools see improved academic performance, mental health and classroom behavior. Communities, families, businesses and civic organizations all benefit from the long term investment in creating a generation of citizens with stronger morals and character. The Greenville location is 1400 E. Main St. behind the Trinity Wesleyan Church so it is just off the actual school property. There is a sidewalk from this location to the school and the children have a volunteer escort to and from the buildings. For the school year 2024 there were 157 students participating in Greenville. The projected figure for school year 2024 – 2025 is 200. Classes are open to grades K thru 8. All schools in Darke County, in their own town, are participating in LifeWise Academy except Tri Village and National Trails. The mission is "to positively impact students, schools and communities by providing a Bible-based character-focused Released Time Religious Instruction (RTRI) program". RTRI is a legal program by which religious instruction is accessible to public school students during the school day, allowing them to leave school (with parental permission) to attend off-site classes, provided by the community, which are both academic and religious in nature. LifeWise Academy is free for all students because of the generous support of people like you.
