REGULAR MEETING MINUTES -- MONDAY, February 9, 2026

Dinner orders were taken, pledge of allegiance was recited led by Cindy Pike and a prayer was given by Delores Ely.

DCRW members and guests present: Angela Armstrong, Gloria Blume, Tom & Charlene Bowman, Megan Delk, Ryan Delk, Delores Ely, Donna Gasper, Jody Harter, Betty Hill, Christy Hole, Peggy Jasenski, Cindy Pike, Trace & Dora Snyder, Sherry Ward and Pepper Wright. Quorum present.

Evening speaker, Ryan Delk, Greenville Safety Services Director, was introduced. Ryan is a 1997 Greenville graduate and a 1999 graduate of Sinclair University. In 1976 he started working for the city mowing the lawn in the city park. In March 2020 he was asked to assist the city safety service director and is now the head Safety Service Director. He runs the day to day operation of the city, having ten employees under him. This takes in fire, police, waste water to name a few. City is now working on a 20 million dollar waste water project, soon start building a water tower at the industrial park and continue to work on upgrading infrastructure in the city. Ryan said a "hot spot" is the many water lines in town that are lead and must be replaced. This is mandated by the state to be completed within ten years. He has a quarterly meeting with police and fire department personnel. A problem in the city is homeless (approx 20 people) that have a drug problem, mental health or just down and out. City personnel try to talk with these people and contact someone/organizations who can help them. Many of the homeless will accept help but revert back after a very short time. Have a lot of homeless cats in town. Ryan has implemented a "Code Force" which works on cleaning up Greenville. Places with a little trash to a house and property that needs cleaned up or torn down. There is a K9 dog with another one coming soon. Always working on bringing new business to Greenville that is a good fit for our town. A project in the works is Sweitzer Street. There is now 4 lanes of traffic, 2 going out of town and 2 coming in. The plan is to have 2 going out of town, 1 coming in and a turn lane. Ryan stays busy writing for grants. BASF is working on selling but will sell to a company that has the same business line. Fram is connected to a larger company which just filed bankruptcy. Fram is connected to Honda so hope things work out well for them and they can stay in business. Ryan has an open door policy so you may stop by or call to have a chat with him most anytime.

BUSINESS MEETING: Cindy Pike made a motion to approve tonight's agenda, 2nd, approved. Motion made by Angela Armstrong to approve minutes from November 10, 2025 meeting, 2nd, approved.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Financial reports given for November, December and January. January 2026 ending balance \$ 1,211.88, Savings \$ 983.57, Memorial fund \$ 71.45. Filed for audit.


